Happy summer! While you are enjoying your summer, please encourage your child to read as much as possible. Reading is one of the most important skills which can impact your child's academic success and confidence!

The following pages have information regarding the math and reading activities our kindergarten teachers would like your child to complete during the summer. Please send the completed activities with your child on the second day of school.

Our teachers strive to create a healthy social and emotional environment to build independent learners and thinkers in their classrooms. To ensure a positive and successful Kindergarten year all children should be able to complete the following skills before the start of school.

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Self Help Skills

Students should be able to...

- 1. zip and unzip backpack
- 2. fasten Velcro shoes
- 3. open and close lunchbox
- 4. verbally state first and last name
- 5. verbally express bathroom needs

Math

Students should be able to ...

- 1. count to 10 orally
- 2. count groups of objects up to 10
- 3. recognize basic shapes: circle, triangle, square, rectangle
- 4. identify positions: above, below, beside, between
- 5. write numbers 0 to 9


English Language Arts

Students should be able to...

- 1. write their first name
- 2. hold a pencil with proper grip
- 3. recognize upper and lower-case letters
- 4. know some letter sounds
- 5. demonstrate front/back/spine of a book
- 6. hold a book properly

Kindergarten Summer Reading

Students will read *Pete the Cat, I Love My White Shoes* by Eric Litwin and James Dean. They may also watch the read aloud by the author, found on YouTube.



- Complete brown bag book report using a lunch bag, grocery bag, brown gift bag, etc.
- On the front of the bag draw the cover of the book. On the back of the bag, write your name.
- Inside the bag, put clues representing the story. You can use any items you wish You will have something white, red, blue, and brown. Be prepared to stand in front of the class and talk about the items you chose.
- In addition to the mandatory book, students will read and record other books of their choosing in the Reading Log included.

Kindergarten Math-Readiness

- Included in this packet is a math readiness packet. Please print the packet and complete all pages.
- We encourage you to pace out the packet for your child. We want students to have a break during the summer yet also review skills that they learned during Pre-K4.
- The packet will be due to your child's teacher on the second day of school.
